MINUTES FROM 2014 ANNUAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING

Friday, June 20, 2014 4:00 p.m. – 5:15p.m. Long Beach, CA

Meeting called to order by Lisa Severy, President, at 4:10pm.

Introductions and recognitions by Lisa Severy:

- NCDA Board of Directors
- Outgoing Board of Directors members each presented with "Outstanding Service Through Board Leadership" awards
- Presented past-president award to Rich Feller
- New incoming Board members -they will start tenure October 1, 2014
- All editors, chairs and members of all NCDA committees, councils and task forces

RS Foundation Award: presented by David Reile and Barbara Suddarth to representative of the Choctaw Nation, Dr. Ken English. This award also comes with a \$350 stipend.

Introduction of Parliamentarian, Mark Pope, by Lisa Severy.

Approval of the Agenda: Motion to approve agenda made by Ron Cathey, of Louisiana; seconded by Janet Wall of Virginia. Add to the agenda the consideration of a new State Division Charter to New Business. Motion carries.

Approval of Minutes: Motion to approve the minutes from the 2013 Annual Membership Meeting made by Marsha Boettger, Michigan and seconded by Sharon Wilson, Virginia. A change of state to Michigan was requested by Marsha Boettger from the 2013 minutes reflected in the motion to adjourn. Motion carries.

Membership Report was introduced and acknowledged by Lisa Severy.

Treasurer's Report by Marilyn Maze, NCDA Treasurer

Marilyn reviewed the audited statements and discussed the Revenues and Expenses as well as the Assets and Liabilities from the previous fiscal year. Marilyn stated that we are in a good financially stable position at this time. There were no questions from the floor.

Approval of Treasurer's Report: Motion to approve the treasurer's report made by Doug Cullen, New Hampshire and seconded by Barbara Suddarth, Maryland. Motion carries.

Old Business: None

New Business:

1. New State Division Charter:

Ron Cathey, Trustee for State Divisions, moves to accept the establishment of a state charter for the Utah Career Development Association (UCDA), seconded by Marsha Boettger, Michigan. Motion carries unanimously. Plaque is presented to

Kathy Leslie, President of UCDA, along with the other officers Mike Brammer, Sam Prestwich and Heidi Vogeler, in recognition of this new state charter.

2. Elections Timing Revision and Process Update:

Mark Danaher discussed the old cycle for elections and reason for the establishment of a new cycle for the elections process. Elections will now occur in June/July (starting at the annual conference). In the spring, the Nominations and Elections Committee will establish a slate of candidates. At the 2015 Annual Meeting (and beyond) members will vote to narrow the slate to two candidates per office. Elections will begin at the Conference and online as well, open for a minimum period of four weeks. Online election information will also be sent to the full membership. In August, the election results will be announced. Officers will begin their term in October. There will only be one exception to this new structure and that is for the "NCDA Representative to the ACA Governing Council" position. ACA requires membership in both ACA and NCDA to be able to run for this position, and will follow the ACA fiscal year (July 1- June 30) for the elections process. Mark stated that with this new structure/timing, NCDA will not have elections this year.

3. Nominations and Elections Committee for 2015-16:

Two volunteer NCDA members are needed to serve on the 2014-2015 to be chaired by three presidents, with immediate past-president as Chair – Lisa Severy. The two members are:

- Stephanie Burns, Michigan
- Pamela Payne, Illinois

4. Membership Designations:

Lisa Severy introduced and explained the new membership categories (see page 11 in 2013-14 Annual Meeting booklet). The Board cleared up confusion that has been a reoccurring problem in the past from the members. The board elected to combine our membership categories and special designations to address the confusion. These new designations would start in 2014 with renewals and new memberships, along with continuing education requirements for those selecting master's designations. Lisa explained that the new designations incorporate two large, overarching membership designations: career counselors and career specialists. Questions were taken from the floor such as: will we see the new categories when we renew, what are the continuing education requirements, who will decide on what is "enough" career experience for the categories, will the categories impact voting and running for office, where do members declare years of experience, etc... Lisa and Mark answered the questions asked by all members, and stated that the new categories will be in the upcoming Career Developments Magazine.

Motion to adjourn made at 5:15p.m. by Don Schutt, Wisconsin and seconded by Ray Davis, South Carolina. Motion carries.

NCDA's Second Century Fund

In 2013, NCDA's Second Century Initiative was started to help strengthen the foundation which bridges NCDA's 2013 Centennial Celebration to its Second Century. This Fund has three main areas:

- 1. Expand Leadership Academy to strengthen NCDA current and future leaders.
- 2. Create A targeted research program to build public awareness of career development interventions/effectiveness. NCDA Research Committee will identify high-return small grant proposals and an annual NCDA Occupational Trend Report will be developed and released nationally to brand NCDA to create public awareness.
- 3. Create Next Generation NCDA Website as "the face of NCDA" utilizing latest technology and social media strategies.

Over the past two years, the fundraising goal was set at \$200,000. As of May 4, 2015, the following chart outlines NCDA's efforts:

Private Donations from Members:	\$ 92,694.00
Interest from the Super Fund:	\$ 65,344.49
Second Century Fund to date:	\$158,038.49

Project expenditures are slated to begin next fiscal year. Members may make donations at the Registration Desk throughout the conference. All donations are tax deductible.
